Message Questions

- 1. When you hear the word Angel what picture comes into your mind? What other words do you associate with the word Angel?
- 2. Name all of the books, movies and television shows that portray Angels. How do the books, movies and television shows portray Angels? How do the portrayals compare or contrast with your picture of an angel?
- 3. Read I Corinthians 13:1, Psalm 78:24-25, Hebrews 1:5 & 14, Psalm 148:2-5 and Daniel 7:10. What different truths do these scriptures tell us about Angels? Did anything that you learned about Angels from the Bible texts surprise you? After reading these texts do you have any more additional questions about Angels?
- 4. The word angel, in both Hebrew and Greek, means messenger. Thus, one role that Angels play are to be messengers of God. Why is it important that we know that Angels are God's messengers? Have you ever received a message from an Angel? Do you know anyone who has received a message from an Angel?
- 5. Hebrews 1:14 tells us that Angels are also ministering spirits to us. How might Angels minister to us? Do you know anyone who has ever been ministered to by an Angel?
- 6. In the Bible, Angels often offer assistance to believers in God (Read Acts 12:1-11). Has an Angel ever offered you assistance? Do you know someone who has been helped by an Angel? If an Angel could offer you assistance what would you want the Angel to help you with? Why would this be your request?
- 7. At times we hear about Guardian Angels. What do you think people mean by Guardian Angels? How would you define a Guardian Angel? Do you think you have a Guardian Angel, why or why not?
- 8. Read Psalm 91:11, what does this text tell us about one of the roles of Angels? What does it not tell us or not guarantee for us?
- 9. Read Revelation 5:11-12. What are the Angels doing in this passage? Why is that important for us to know? How should the Angels behavior influence our own and why?
- 10. Out of all of the roles that Angels have (Messengers, Ministering Spirits, Divine Assistance, Protectors, Examples of Worship), what role would you want an Angel to play in your life? Why?
